Work Over Several Years

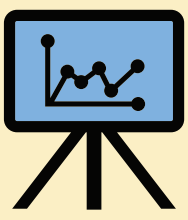
Once you've worked your first season, and especially if you've performed well, you can often count on returning to the same place in future seasons.
